It is hard **waiting** for something to happen. It feels as if it will never come to pass.

But if the Holy Spirit has spoken to you, that a need will be met, it will be so.
Habakkuk 2:3 says, “Though it tarries, **wait for it**, because it will surely come to pass.”

“Do not become sluggish, but follow those who through **faith and patience** inherit the promises.”
Hebrews 6:12.

While we **wait, the Lord is at work**, working for us. Isaiah 64:4. (KJV margin).

It takes time for things to change.

Sometimes attitudes have to change, but in it all, the Lord is at work for our good. Romans 8:28.
In some cases relationships have to be adjusted. This all takes time.

Seek the Lord and keep listening to His voice. He will speak to you through His Word, as you keep reading it.

Refresh your mind on what the Lord has said. Boldly declare His Word and keep believing the Word the Holy Spirit has spoken to you. Hebrews 10:23, 3:1, Psalm 1:1-3, Psalm 119:89, Isaiah 55:11, Psalm 84:11.

Jesus said, “Let those who have ears to hear, go on hearing.” Matthew 13:9.

“Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every Word that comes from the mouth of God.” Matthew 4:4.

We have, “Exceeding great and precious promises, that through these we might be partakers of the Divine Nature.” 2Peter 1:4

Jesus said, “What-ever things you desire, when you pray, **believe that you receive them**, and you shall **have them**.” Mark 11:24

Sometimes there is a period of waiting between, “**believe that you receive them**” and “**you shall have them**”

It is very important that in this waiting period, you continue in strongly believing that “you have received them”.

Often this **waiting** time is not easy.

But continue to **believe that you have received** the meeting of your need, **according to the promises of God**, and you will “have” them, as Jesus said. Mark 11:24.

In James 1:5-8, it says, “If anyone lacks wisdom, let him ask God for it, **and it will be given to him**.”

But let him ask in faith without doubting.” (KJV margin).

If we know that what we ask for is in the will of God, (as it says in James 1:5, in this case asking for wisdom), we must believe that God will give us the wisdom we have asked for, as He has promised.

God is faithful to keep His Word and to fulfil what he has promised.

Jeremiah 1:12, in the margin of the KJV, it says, “**I will watch over My Word to perform it.**”

As we believe the Word God has spoken to us, God is watching over His Word to perform it, in our lives.
